Located only .25 miles away from the Wiehle-Reston East Metro Station and .7 miles away from the Washington & Old Dominion (W&OD Trail), the Agile Defense corporate headquarters is conveniently available via metro, bus, and by bike allowing for environmentally friendly modes of travel to and from our offices. The corporate headquarters building also boasts Green Living Initiatives to include LED bulbs in common areas, energy star-rated air conditioners and refrigerators, natural gas usage, and insulation of hot water and steam pipes to reduce fuel consumption. All throughout our office facility, recycling and waste areas are clearly marked to ensure proper disposal of litter. In addition, our office management offers reusable mugs and insulated, reusable water bottles for consumption of coffee, tea, and/or filtered water.
